*You are hereby notified that I have amended Approval No. 7667-8KCQDY issued on October 25, 2011 for a petroleum refinery , as follows:*

The following equipment has been added to the *Approval*:

- one (1) above ground, floating roof sour water storage tank (TNK280), having a storage capacity of 3498 cubic metres;
- one (1) above ground, floating roof sour water storage tank (TNK281), having a storage capacity of 3498 cubic metres;

The following equipment has been removed from the *Approval*:

- one (1) above ground, fixed roof sour water storage tank (SWtk101), having a storage capacity of 2385 cubic metres;
- one (1) above ground, fixed roof sour water storage tank (SW Tk102), having a storage capacity of 2385 cubic metres;

all in accordance with the application for Environmental Compliance Approval (Air) dated June 16, 2022 and signed by Michelle Camilleri of Imperial Oil Limited, the Emission Summary and Dispersion Modelling Report dated June 16, 2022 and signed by Scott Manser of ORTECH Consulting Incorporated, and the emails from Michelle Camilleri dated December 13, 2022 and December 15, 2022.

## 8KCQDY dated October 25, 2011

In accordance with Section 139 of the *Environmental Protection Act*, you may by written notice served upon me, the Ontario Land Tribunal and in accordance with Section 47 of the *Environmental Bill of Rights*, 1993, the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks, within 15 days after receipt of this notice, require a hearing by the Tribunal. The Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks will place notice of your appeal on the Environmental Registry. Section 142 of the *Environmental Protection Act* provides that the notice requiring the hearing ("the Notice") shall state:

- a. The portions of the environmental compliance approval or each term or condition in the environmental compliance approval in respect of which the hearing is required, and;
- b. The grounds on which you intend to rely at the hearing in relation to each portion appealed.

Pursuant to subsection 139(3) of the *Environmental Protection Act*, a hearing may not be required with respect to any terms and conditions in this environmental compliance approval, if the terms and conditions are substantially the same as those contained in an approval that is amended or revoked by this environmental compliance approval.

The Notice should also include:

1. The name of the appellant;
2. The address of the appellant;
3. The environmental compliance approval number;
4. The date of the environmental compliance approval;
5. The name of the Director, and;
6. The municipality or municipalities within which the project is to be engaged in.

And the Notice should be signed and dated by the appellant.
