Upon issuance of the environmental compliance approval, I hereby revoke Approval No(s) 1536-7XYJ28, issued on May 31, 2010.

You have applied under section 20.2 of Part II.1 of the *Environmental Protection Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. E. 19 (*Environmental Protection Act*) for approval of:

The Neudorf facility fabricates metal parts for automotive industry, consisting of the following equipment:

- one (1) 90 ton press;
- two (2) 110 ton press;
- one (1) 200 ton press;
- one (1) 220 ton press;
- one (1) 250 ton press;
- three (3) 300 ton press;
- one (1) 400 ton press;

- one (1) 600 ton press;
- two (2) 800 ton press;
- one (1) exhaust system serving two (2) welding stations with fume collection hood, exhausting into the air at a volumetric flow rate of 1.40 cubic metres per second, through a stack identified as S2, having exit dimensions of 0.46 metre by 0.46 metre, extending 1.37 metres above the roof and 5.90 metres above grade; and
- fugitive emissions from one (1) maintenance welding station, discharging passively into the air through any open doors and windows;

all in accordance with the Application for Approval (Air and noise) submitted by Neudorf Stamping Corporation, dated June 30, 2023 and signed by Lisa Taylor, Office Manager, the supporting information, including the Emission Summary and Dispersion Modelling Report, submitted by Dillion Consulting Limited. dated June 26, 2023 and signed by Jillian Hicks-McClary; and an email update provided by David Diemer on October 03, 2024, and the Acoustic Assessment Report, submitted by Dillon Consulting Limited, dated November 2023 and prepared by Elham Alavi and Amir Iravani.

## **DEFINITIONS**

For the purpose of this environmental compliance approval, the following definitions apply:

- "Acoustic Assessment Report" means the report, prepared in accordance with Publication NPC-233, by Amir Iravani of Dillon Consulting Limited and dated November 2023 submitted in support of the application, that documents all sources of noise emissions and Noise Control Measures present at the Facility;
- 2. "EPA" means the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.E.19;
- 3. "Equipment" means the described in the Company`s application, this Approval and in the supporting documentation submitted with the application, to the extent approved by this Approval;
- 4. "Approval" means this Environmental Compliance Approval, including the application and supporting documentation listed above;
- 5. "Company" means Neudorf Stamping Corporation operating as Neudorf Stamping Corporation that is responsible for the construction or operation of the Facility and includes any successors and assigns in accordance with section 19 of the EPA;
- 6. "District Manager" means the District Manager of the appropriate local district office of the Ministry, where the Facility is geographically located;
- 7. "Facility" means the entire operation located on the property where the Equipment is

located;

- 8. "Manual" means a document or a set of documents that provide written instructions to staff of the Company;
- 9. "Ministry" means the ministry of the government of Ontario responsible for the EPA and includes all officials, employees or other persons acting on its behalf;
- 10. "Publication NPC-207" means the Ministry draft technical publication "Impulse Vibration in Residential Buildings", November 1983, supplementing the Model Municipal Noise Control By-Law, Final Report, August 1978, published by the Ministry; and
- 11. "Publication NPC-300" means the Ministry Publication NPC-300,"Environmental Noise Guideline, Stationary and Transportation Sources Approval and Planning, Publication NPC-300", August 2013, as amended.

### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

You are hereby notified that this environmental compliance approval is issued to you subject to the terms and conditions outlined below:

#### 1. OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

- 1. The Company shall ensure that the Equipment is properly operated and maintained at all times. The Company shall:
  - a. prepare, not later than three (3) months after the date of this Approval, and update, as necessary, a Manual outlining the operating procedures and a maintenance program for the Equipment, including:
    - i. routine operating and maintenance procedures in accordance with good engineering practices and as recommended by the Equipment suppliers;
    - ii. emergency procedures, including spill clean-up procedures;
    - iii. procedures for any record keeping activities relating to operation and maintenance of the Equipment;
    - iv. all appropriate measures to minimize noise and odorous emissions from all potential sources; and
    - v. the frequency of inspection and replacement of the filter material in the Equipment;
  - b. implement the recommendations of the Manual.

#### 2. RECORD RETENTION

1. The Company shall retain, for a minimum of two (2) years from the date of their creation, all records and information related to or resulting from the recording

activities required by this Approval, and make these records available for review by staff of the Ministry upon request. The Company shall retain:

- a. all records on the maintenance, repair and inspection of the Equipment; and
- b. all records of any environmental complaints, including:
  - i. a description, time and date of each incident to which the complaint relates;
  - ii. wind direction at the time of the incident to which the complaint relates; and
  - iii. a description of the measures taken to address the cause of the incident to which the complaint relates and to prevent a similar occurrence in the future.

#### 3. NOTIFICATION OF COMPLAINTS

- 1. The Company shall notify the District Manager, in writing, of each environmental complaint within two (2) business days of the complaint. The notification shall include:
  - a. a description of the nature of the complaint; and
  - b. the time and date of the incident to which the complaint relates.

#### 4. NOISE

- 1. The Company shall, at all times, ensure that the noise emissions from the Facility comply with the limits set out in Ministry Publication NPC-300;
- 2. The Company shall, at all times, ensure that the vibration emissions from the Facility comply with the limits set in Publication NPC-207;
- 3. The Company shall ensure that the Bay Doors BD1, BD3 and BD4, described in the Acoustic Assessment Report, remain closed except to accommodate immediate ingress and egress;
- 4. The Company shall ensure that vibration isolation under the 300, 400, 600 and 800 Ton presses, described in the Acoustic Assessment Report, are maintained; and
- 5. The Company shall ensure that the operation of the Equipment/Facility is confined to the daytime period between 7:00 AM and 7:00 PM.

#### CHANGE OF OWNERSHIP

1. The Company shall notify the Director in writing, and forward a copy of the notification to the District Manager, within thirty (30) days of the occurrence of any of the following changes to the Facility operations:

- a. the ownership of the Facility;
- b. the operator of the Facility;
- c. the address of the Company;
- d. the partners, where the Company is or at any time becomes a partnership and a copy of the most recent declaration filed under the *Business Names Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. B.17, shall be included in the notification; or
- e. the name of the corporation where the Company is or at any time becomes a corporation, other than a municipal corporation, and a copy of the most current information filed under the *Corporations Information Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. C.39, shall be included in the notification.
- 2. In the event of any change in ownership of the Facility, the Company shall notify the successor of the existence of this Approval and provide the successor with a copy of this Approval, and the Company shall provide a copy of the notification to the District Manager and the Director.

# **REASONS**

The reasons for the imposition of these terms and conditions are as follows:

- 1. Condition No. 1 is included to emphasize that the Equipment must be maintained and operated according to a procedure that will result in compliance with the EPA, the Regulations and this Approval.
- 2. Condition No. 2 is included to require the Company to keep records and to provide information to staff of the Ministry so that compliance with the EPA, the Regulations and this Approval can be verified.
- 3. Condition No. 3 is included to require the Company to notify staff of the Ministry so as to assist the Ministry with the review of the site's compliance.
- 4. Condition No. 4 is included to provide the minimum performance requirements considered necessary to prevent an adverse effect resulting from the operation of the Facility.
- 5. Condition 5 is included to require the Company to notify/report to the Ministry so that compliance with the EPA, the regulations and this Approval can be verified.

## APPEAL PROVISIONS

In accordance with Section 139 of the *Environmental Protection Act*, you may by written notice served upon me and the Ontario Land Tribunal, within 15 days after the service of this notice, require a hearing by the Tribunal. You must also provide notice to, the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks in accordance with Section 47 of the *Environmental Bill of Rights*, 1993 who will place notice of your appeal on the Environmental Registry. Section 142 of the *Environmental Protection Act* provides that the notice requiring the hearing ("the Notice") shall state:

- 1. The portions of the environmental compliance approval or each term or condition in the environmental compliance approval in respect of which the hearing is required, and;
- 2. The grounds on which you intend to rely at the hearing in relation to each portion appealed.

Pursuant to subsection 139(3) of the *Environmental Protection Act*, a hearing may not be required with respect to any terms and conditions in this environmental compliance approval, if the terms and conditions are substantially the same as those contained in an approval that is amended or revoked by this environmental compliance approval.

The Notice should also include:

- 1. The name of the appellant;
- 2. The address of the appellant;
- 3. The environmental compliance approval number;
- 4. The date of the environmental compliance approval;
- 5. The name of the Director, and;
- 6. The municipality or municipalities within which the project is to be engaged in.

And the Notice should be signed and dated by the appellant.
