*You are hereby notified that I have amended Approval No. 7667-8KCQDY issued on October 25, 2011 for a petroleum refinery , as follows:*

The introductory description section is removed and replaced with the following:

- a petroleum refinery having a design capacity of processing 20,000 cubic metres per day of crude oil and vegetable oil to produce propane, propylene, butane, gasolines, furnace fuel, diesel oil, aviation fuel, heavy fuel oil and asphalt, consisting of the following sources of air emission:

The following equipment has been added to the *Approval*:

- one (1) above ground, heated vegetable oil storage tank (ID: 20-T-785), having a storage capacity of 11,129 cubic metres;

all in accordance with the application for Environmental Compliance Approval (Air) dated December 23, 2024 and signed by Michelle Camilleri of Imperial Oil Limited, the Emission Summary and Dispersion Modelling Report dated December 31, 2024 and signed by Ibrahim Syed of Alliance Technical Group, the email from Ibrahim Syed dated January 23, 2025 and the Acoustic Assessment Report from Hatch dated January 31, 2025 and signed by Mervyn Choy.

**This Notice shall constitute part of the approval issued under Approval No. 7667-8KCQDY dated October 25, 2011**

In accordance with Section 139 of the *Environmental Protection Act*, you may by written

notice served upon me, the Ontario Land Tribunal and in accordance with Section 47 of the *Environmental Bill of Rights*, 1993, the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks, within 15 days after receipt of this notice, require a hearing by the Tribunal. The Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks will place notice of your appeal on the Environmental Registry. Section 142 of the *Environmental Protection Act* provides that the notice requiring the hearing ("the Notice") shall state:

- a. The portions of the environmental compliance approval or each term or condition in the environmental compliance approval in respect of which the hearing is required, and;
- b. The grounds on which you intend to rely at the hearing in relation to each portion appealed.

Pursuant to subsection 139(3) of the *Environmental Protection Act*, a hearing may not be required with respect to any terms and conditions in this environmental compliance approval, if the terms and conditions are substantially the same as those contained in an approval that is amended or revoked by this environmental compliance approval.

The Notice should also include:

1. The name of the appellant;
2. The address of the appellant;
3. The environmental compliance approval number;
4. The date of the environmental compliance approval;
5. The name of the Director, and;
6. The municipality or municipalities within which the project is to be engaged in.

And the Notice should be signed and dated by the appellant.
