PART A - REQUIREMENTS

Pursuant to my authority under **OWRA | 62**, I require you to do the following:

Item No. 1 Compliance Due Date: November 19, 2025

Upon service of this Director's Report and until Sewage Works No. 2 at the Site has been replaced and is fully operational, at a minimum, monitor the sewage level in the septic tank and pumping chamber of Sewage Works No. 2 at the Site on a weekly basis.

Item No. 2 Compliance Due Date: November 19, 2025

Upon service of this Director's Report and until Sewage Works No. 2 at the Site has been replaced and is fully operational, arrange to have the contents of the septic tank and pump chamber of Sewage Works No. 2 pumped by a Ministry approved Sewage hauler for off-Site disposal at a Ministry approved receiving site before the sewage level in the septic tank reaches 85% to ensure that Sewage Works No. 2 does not discharge raw or improperly treated sewage to the surface and/or into the ground.

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PART B - DIRECTOR'S OPINION

This Director's Report is being issued for the reasons set out below.

Definitions

For the purposes of this Director's Report, the following capitalized terms shall have the meanings set out below:

"Adverse Effect" has the same meaning as in subsection 1(1) of the EPA.

"Company" means 2677041 Ontario Inc.

"Sewage" has the same meaning as in section 1 of the OWRA.

"Sewage Works" has the same meaning as in section 1 of the OWRA.

"Site" means 2-20 Wilson Street in the Village of Elgin, Township of Rideau Lakes, Ontario and legally described as PT 11 CON 2 SOUTH CROSBY; PT LT B PL 88 AS IN LR244487; S/T 10S5161, SC8274; RIDEAU LAKES, PIN 442830149.

Description of Municipality Subject to the Director's Report

The Corporation of the Municipality of Rideau Lakes is a municipal corporation established or continued under the Municipal Act that operates under the name of Township of Rideau Lakes. The township is located in Eastern Ontario, northeast of Kingston. It is a rural township with several villages and hamlets. The township has approximately 10,883 residents.

Description of the Site and Sewage Works

Maple Grove Mobile Home Park is a year-round residential trailer park consisting of 19 mobile homes. The park is located in the Town of Elgin within the municipality of Rideau Lakes.

The Site is not municipally serviced. Tenants rely on an on-Site water well for their water supply and Sewage is managed on-Site.

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The Site is located in an area where groundwater is vulnerable to surface and near surface contaminants.

The mobile homes at the Site are serviced by three separate Sewage Works as follows:

- Sewage Works No. 1 services ten two-bedroom dwellings
- Sewage Works No. 2 services ten two-bedroom dwellings
- Sewage Works No. 3 services an abandoned laundromat and car wash

A diagram showing the approximately location of the three Sewage Works is enclosed with the Order in Attachment 1 of this Director's Report.

The three sewage works were authorized to be constructed and operated under permits issued by the Health Unit in the 1970s and 1980s under Part VIII of the EPA as it was in force at the time.

2677041 Ontario Inc. (the 'Company') is the current owner of the Site on which Maple Grove Maple Home Park is located and on which the Sewage Works servicing the Site are found. Resham Singh Gill is the sole director of the Company and Ramandeep (Raman) Singh Gill is the park manager and Resham Singh Gill's son. Provincial Officer Nathalie Matthews advises me that she has interacted with Raman Singh Gill on various occasions concerning the Site and he has exercised decision-making authority on behalf of the Company in this regard.

Raman Singh Gill has advised Provincial Officer Matthews that he is responsible for managing the activities at the Site and that Resham Singh Gill has limited proficiency in English.

Reasons for the Director's Report

Ministry Provincial Officer Matthews issued the Order to both the Company and Resham Singh Gill on June 9, 2025 and the Order was deemed served by June 11, 2025. A copy of the initial Order is attached as Attachment 1.

In response to a request from Raman Singh Gill, Provincial Officer Matthews amended the initial Order to extend nine compliance dates. A copy of the amendment is attached as Attachment 2.

The Order was issued to address failures experienced at Sewage Works No. 2 that resulted in raw or improperly treated Sewage being discharged to the surface at the Site. Briefly, the Order requires the Company and Resham Singh Gill to prevent the discharges from occurring and to retain a licensed engineering professional to remediate the impacts from the discharges, assess all the Sewage Works at the Site, and propose what steps should be taken to improve or replace the Sewage Works, as necessary.

On July 30, 2025, Mr. Nick Hogan, a licensed Sewage Works installer reported to Provincial Officer Matthews that he had assessed the bed of Sewage Works No. 2 and confirmed that it

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needed to be replaced. Mr. Hogan further advised that Raman Singh Gill was notified of his findings.

On October 1, 2025, Raman Singh Gill advised Provincial Officer Matthews that he was unable to afford to comply with all requirements of the Order or to replace the disposal bed of Sewage Works No. 2.

On October 28, 2025, Provincial Officer Nathalie Matthews and I attended the Site and opened the lid of the septic tank for Sewage Works No. 2 and observed that the sewage level appeared to be near the top of the septic tank.

On November 6, 2025, an employee of Bryan's Septic Service, a Ministry approved Sewage hauler, reported the following to Provincial Officer Matthews:

- They had periodically pumped out the septic tank for Sewage Works No. 2.
- Based on employee observations, the septic tank and pump chamber of Sewage Works No. 2 should be emptied every seven days to prevent discharges to the natural environment. Raman Singh Gill was advised that the septic tank should be emptied between six and ten days.
- The pump in the pump chamber of Sewage Works No. 2 was inoperative and required replacement to prevent Sewage backup into connected residences.
- The septic tank of Sewage Works No. 2 was last emptied approximately three weeks ago (i.e. on October 18, 2025).
- If Sewage in the septic tank and pump chamber of Sewage Works No. 2 is not regularly pumped, Sewage will either seep around the tank and/or backup into connected residences.
- In many instances, there have been prolonged delays in the payment for the pumpouts at the Site.
- Future pump-outs will not be conducted unless payment is provided prior to the pumpout.

On November 12, 2025, Provincial Officer Matthews was informed that Raman Singh Gill had pre-paid Bryan's Septic Service to remove one truckload of Sewage from the septic tank/pump chamber of Sewage Works No. 2. Later that day, the Sewage hauler reported that although one full truckload of Sewage had been removed, the tank/pump chamber was not fully emptied and would require another pump-out within two to three days. The Sewage hauler confirmed that Raman Singh Gill had been advised.

On November 17, 2025, the Sewage hauler and a tenant at the Site reported that the pump had not been replaced or repaired and that the septic tank/pump chamber of Sewage Works No. 2 had not been emptied.

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To date, the Company and Resham Singh Gill have not fully complied with any of the Work Ordered Items of the Order and the septic tank and pump chamber of Sewage Works No. 2 are not regularly pumped to avoid discharges to the natural environment.

Since 2024, Raman Singh Gill has failed to address the Ministry's concerns, despite repeated requests.

Raman Singh Gill has not responded to Provincial Officer Matthew's telephone messages, texts or emails since October 6, 2025. The last communication was a telephone call I made to Raman Singh Gill on October 29, 2025 in which Mr. Gill indicated that certain actions would be taken. However, none of those actions were in fact taken.

Raw or partially treated Sewage contains pollutants such as pharmaceuticals, nitrates, nutrients, pathogens, viruses and bacteria, including E. coli. Discharges of these pollutants to ground surface may expose humans and animals to harmful microorganisms, posing health risks – particulary to vulnerable populations, such as children and the elderly.

Seepage of raw or partially treated Sewage from the septic tank of Sewage Works No. 2 may impair groundwater quality. The Site's drinking water supply is located approximately 20 meters from the septic tank and pump chamber of Sewage Works No. 2. The presence of bacteria, pathogens, viruses and elevated nitrates in drinking water may result in adverse health effects.

A low lying area is located approximately five meters north of the septic tank and pump chamber of Sewage Works No. 2, and approximately ten meters from the Site's drinking water well. In this area, shallow groundwater and associated contaminants may discharge to the surface. Additionally, impacted groundwater may migrate to a wetland located approximately 100 meters away, or to an intermittent creek approximately 50 meters away that flows off Site.

The lack of action and communication by the Company and Mr. Gill is a serious concern. I am of the opinion that discharges of raw or improperly treated sewage are likely to occur unless the municipality implements the actions required by this Report.

Authority to Issue the Director's Report

I am issuing this Director's Report under my authority as a Director under the following legislation, which also includes the authority to take intermediate action and/or procedural steps:

This report is issued under section 62 of the OWRA.

For the reasons set out above, I am of the opinion that it is necessary and in the public interest that Sewage Works No. 2, which, to my understanding, services ten residential units at the Site, be operated and maintained by the Corporation of the Municipality of Rideau Lakes as described in the Part A requirements of this Report to protect human health and the environment.

PART A - WORK ORDERED

Pursuant to my authority under EPA | 157.1, OWRA | 16.1, OWRA | 16.2, EPA | 197 | (1), OWRA | 103, I order you, jointly and severally, unless otherwise indicated, to do the following:

Item No. 1

Upon service of this Order, immediately take all practicable steps to prevent the discharge of Sewage from the septic tank servicing Sewage Works #2.

Item No. 2

By June 23, 2025, submit to the Provincial Officer by email to nathalie. matthews@ontario.ca and to environment.kingston@ontario.ca a written report describing the measures that have been put in place to prevent any discharges of Sewage from occurring as required by Work Ordered Item No. 1.

Item No. 3

By June 23, 2025, retain the services of a LEP satisfactory to the Provincial Officer to carry out the work described in Work Ordered Item No. 5 and Work Ordered Item No.7.

Item No. 4

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By June 23, 2025, submit to the Provincial Officer written confirmation from the LEP by email to nathalie.matthews@ontario.ca and to environment. kingston@ontario.ca that they have (a) received a copy of this Order, (b) been retained to complete work as described in Work Ordered Item No. 5 and Work Ordered Item No. 7 of this Order; and (c) the experience and qualifications to carry out such work.

Item No. 5

By July 11, 2025, have the retained LEP prepare a written work plan that describes how environmental impacts caused by the failed bed of Sewage Works #2 will be assessed and remediated (hereafter referred to as the Spill Assessment and Remediation Work Plan). The Spill Assessment and Remediation Work Plan shall include, at a minimum, the following:

- (a) a diagram of the Site drawn to scale, with property boundaries and surface water features, which outlines the areas that will be assessed;
- (b) the methodology for assessing the Sewage impacted areas; and
- (c) the measures that will be taken to remediate the Sewage impacted areas.

Item No. 6

By July 11, 2025, submit to the Provincial Officer, by email at nathalie. matthews@ontario.ca and environment.kingston@ontario.ca, the written Spill Assessment and Remediation Work Plan required by Work Ordered Item No. 5, for review and acceptance.

Item No. 7

Upon receiving the written acceptance of the Provincial Officer a) arrange for the retained LEP to implement the accepted Spill Assessment and Remediation Work Plan and; b) submit to the Provincial Officer by email to nathalie.matthews@ontario.ca and environment.kingston@ontario.ca, a final written report, prepared by the retained LEP, that includes at a minimum a summary of all findings and conclusions resulting from the implementation of the accepted Spill Assessment and Remediation Work Plan, such that all work in the accepted Spill Assessment Work and Remediation Work Plan and the written report required by Work Ordered Item No. 7 of this Order are completed and submitted to the Provincial Officer by August 22, 2025.

Item No. 8

By June 23, 2025, retain the services of a LEP or a Registered Sewage Contractor satisfactory to the Provincial Officer to carry out the work described in Work Ordered Item No. 10 of this Order.

Item No. 9

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By June 23, 2025, submit written confirmation from the LEP or Registered Sewage Contractor to the Provincial Officer by email to nathalie. matthews@ontario.ca and to environment.kingston@ontario.ca that they have: (a) received a copy of this Order; (b) been retained to carry out the work as described in Work Ordered No. 10 of this Order; and (c) the experience and qualifications to carry out such work.

Item No. 10

By July 31, 2025, have the retained LEP or Registered Sewage Contractor fully assess all Sewage Works located on the Site. The findings, conclusions and recommendations associated with the assessment shall be documented in a written report prepared by the retained LEP or Registered Sewage Contractor, and shall include, at a minimum:

- (a) A description of each Sewage Works, including size, dimension, design capacity, and what facilities each Sewage Works services;
- (b) A diagram drawn to scale, which identifies the location of all components of each Sewage Works, property boundaries, wells and surface water features;
- (c) A description of all deficiencies with any of the Sewage Works;
- (d) Recommendations for addressing deficiencies with any of the Sewage Works;
- (e) The purpose of the catch basin located adjacent to Sewage Works #1; and
- (g) A design description of the catch basin located adjacent to Sewage Works #1.

Item No. 11

By August 22, 2025, submit, to the Provincial Officer, by email at nathalie. matthews@ontario.ca and environment.kingston@ontario.ca, the written assessment report required by Work Ordered Item No. 10 of this Order.

Item No. 12

Upon service of this Order, the Company and any person with an interest in the Site shall, before dealing with the Site in any way, provide a copy of this Order, including any amendments thereto, to every person who will acquire an interest in the Site as a result of the dealing.

Item No. 13

Within fourteen (14) days of receipt of an acknowledgement and direction

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form signed by the Provincial Officer, enclosing a certificate of requirement, the Company shall register the certificate of requirement issued under subsection 103(2) of the OWRA on title to the Site, in the appropriate land registry office.

Item No. 14

Within fourteen (14) days of registering the certificate of requirement on title, provide the Provincial Officer by email to nathalie.matthews@ontario.ca and to environment.kingston@ontario.ca written confirmation that the certificate of requirement has been registered on title as required by Work Ordered Item No. 13 of this Order by providing a copy of the registered document and the updated parcel register for the PIN for the Site.

"ECA" means environmental compliance approval.

"EPA" means Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. E. 19.

"Licensed Engineering Practitioner" means a person that holds a licence, limited licence or temporary licence under the Professional Engineers Act and has demonstrated experience and expertise in the areas relating to the work required to be carried out by the Licensed Engineering Practitioner in this Order.

"Ministry" means Ontario Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks.

Description of Person(s) Subject to the Order

The Company is an active Ontario corporation (Ontario Corporation Number 2677041) that was incorporated on January 21, 2019.

The Company currently owns the Site and has been the owner of the Site since November 9, 2021. Resham Singh Gill is the sole director of the Company and, as such, has management and control of the Company, the Site and the Sewage Works located on the Site.

Description of the Site and/or System/Facility

The Site is in a rural area which is not serviced with municipally treated water or sewage. Property owners rely on groundwater for their water supplies.

The Site is surrounded by residential properties to the north, west and south. An intermittent creek flows through the Site, that discharges to a municipal ditch.

The Site includes nineteen (19) mobile homes. A laundromat and carwash facilities at the Site appear to be permanently shut down.

A diagram of the Site and surrounding properties is enclosed in the Attachments section of this Order and identified as Document 1.

The Site is serviced with three on-Site subsurface Sewage Works and an on-Site drilled water well.

Based on the Building Code, the Site's total daily sewage flow is greater than 10,000 liters per day and, as such, the Sewage Works located on the Site must be installed and operated in accordance with an Environmental Compliance Approval as required under section 53 of the OWRA.

The three Sewage Works are roughly identified on the diagram enclosed in the Attachments section of this Order and identified as Document 1. According to the Ministry's files the following approvals were issued under repealed Part 8 of the EPA for Sewage Works servicing the Site:

- Sewage Works #1: LG-362-76 and LG-363-76 were issued for a Sewage Works to service ten homes. Copies of LG-362-76 and LG363-76 are enclosed in the Attachments section of this Order and are identified as Document 2 and Document 3, respectively.
- Sewage Works #2: LG-211-81 was issued for a Sewage Works to service ten homes. LG-211-81 does not specify which homes are connected to Sewage Works #2. A copy of LG-211-81 is enclosed in the Attachments section of this Order and identified as Document 4.

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• Sewage Works #3: LG-364-76, LG-075-95 and LG-087-95 were issued for a Sewage Works to service the laundromat and the car washing facilities. A copy of LG-364-76 is enclosed in the Attachments section of this Order and identified as Document 5. A copy of LG-075-95 is enclosed in the Attachments section of this Order and identified as Document 6. A copy of LG-087-95 is enclosed in the Attachments section of this Order and identified as Document 7.

Although Part 8 of the EPA has been repealed, these approvals are deemed to be ECAs for the purposes of section 53 of the OWRA.

Reasons for the Order

Since the Company purchased the Site, the Ministry received multiple complaints concerning the Site's Sewage Works. In response to these concerns, I contacted Ramandeep Singh Gill, the manager of the Site and the son of Resham Singh Gill. During my interactions with Ramandeep Singh Gill, he demonstrated decision-making authority on behalf of the Company.

I conducted an inspection of the Site's Sewage Works in the summer of 2024. A written inspection report was sent by courier to Resham Singh Gill on October 13, 2024 and to Ramandeep Singh Gill by email on October 14, 2024.

Due to the age of the Sewage Works, the presence of wet and spongy areas near/at Sewage Works #2 and the lack of information about the catch basin located adjacent to Sewage Works #1, my inspection report requested that the Company:

- 1. retain a qualified person to:
- a) assess all Sewage Works located at the Site;
- b) prepare a written report on the assessment of the Sewage Works which includes, but is not necessarily limited to:
- (i) a description of each Sewage Works, including size, dimension and location of all components of each Sewage Works;
- (ii) a description of which mobile homes are connected to each Sewage Works;
- (iii) a diagram, drawn to scale, which identifies the location of all components of each Sewage Works;
- (iv) a description of all deficiencies associated with each Sewage Works;
- (v) recommendations for addressing the deficiencies;
- (vi) the purpose of the catch basin located adjacent to the tile bed identified in purple (refer to the diagram referred to as Document 1 in the Attachments section of this Order); and
- 2. submit, to the Provincial Officer, a copy of the assessment report prepared by the retained qualified person.

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Conservation and Parks

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To date, written confirmation that a qualified person was retained has not been received, nor has a report on an assessment of the Sewage Works and the catch basin located at the Site been submitted to the Ministry.

On May 14, 2025, a resident at the Site reported a Sewage spill to the Ministry. I responded to the incident and confirmed the presence of wet and spongy areas over and adjacent to the bed associated with Sewage Works #2. Black and sewage smelling material was also present in a dry intermittent creek located along the southern edge of the Sewage disposal bed associated with Sewage Works #2. Based on these observations, it appeared that the bed had failed at multiple locations and that Sewage had discharged to a dry intermittent creek.

Sewage is a contaminant that may cause an Adverse Effect due to the high bacteria contained within it. The discharge of improperly treated sewage may also impair the quality of groundwater and/or surface water.

Authority to Issue the Order

Based on the facts outlined in 'Reasons for the Order section above of this order, I reasonably believe that it is in the public interest to issue this Order to: (a) the Company who owns, manages and controls the Sewage Works at the Site; and (b) Resham Singh Gill who is the sole director of the Company.

I reasonably believe that the requirements specified in this Order are in the public interest to prevent the discharge of sewage into groundwater and/or surface water and to ensure the protection of public health and the natural environment.

I reasonably believe that the requirements specified in this Order are necessary to prevent or reduce the risk of any abnormal discharge of Sewage into the natural environment at the Site and to prevent, decrease or eliminate Adverse Effects, namely impairment of the quality of the natural environment (i.e. soil, surface water and groundwater) for any use that can be made of it, that may result from the presence or discharge of Sewage in, on or under the Site.

I believe that the requirements of this Order are necessary to determine the level of risk and/or impacts to on and off-Site receptors, and to determine whether protective measures and/or remedial work is warranted to prevent or reduce one or more Adverse Effects.

Lastly, I believe that the requirements in Work Ordered Item No. 12, Work Ordered Item No. 13 and Work Ordered Item No. 14 are necessary to ensure that any person who may acquire an interest in the Site is made aware of the issues and work described in this Order.
