*You have applied under section 20.2 of Part II.1 of the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. E. 19 (Environmental Protection Act) for approval of:*

a 2.27 hectares Waste Disposal Site to be used for the processing and transfer of the following types of waste:

solid waste limited to Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE) and WEEE components.

Note: Use of the Site for any other type of waste is not approved under this Environmental Compliance Approval, and requires obtaining a separate Approval amending this Environmental Compliance Approval.

*For the purpose of this environmental compliance approval, the following definitions apply:*

"Approval" means this Environmental Compliance Approval and Schedules to it, including the application and supporting documentation listed in Schedule "A";

"Director" means any Ministry employee appointed in writing by the Minister pursuant to section 5 of the EPA as a Director for the purposes of Part II.1 of the EPA;

"District Manager" means the District Manager of the local district office of the Ministry in which the Site is geographically located;

"EPA" means Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.E. 19, as amended;

"Fire Code" means Fire Code - Ontario Regulation 213/07, made under the Fire Protection and Prevention Act, 1997, S.O. 1997, c.4, as amended;

"Hazardous Components" means components manually removed from Waste Electrical and Electronic

Equipment which have hazardous properties including, but not limited to, batteries, Cathode Ray Tubes, fluorescent lamps, condensers/ capacitors and switches;

"Ministry" means the Ministry of Environment, Conservation and Parks responsible for the EPA and OWRA and includes all official, employees or other persons acting on its behalf;

"NMA" means the Nutrient Management Act, 2002, S.O. 2002, c.4, as amended;

"Operator" means any person, other than the Owner's employees, authorized by the Owner as having the charge, management or control of any aspect of the Site;

"Owner" means any person that is responsible for the establishment or operation of the Site being approved by this Approval, and includes E-Cycle Solution Inc., its successors or assigns;

"Ontario Regulation 389/16" means Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment, made under the Waste Diversion Transition Act, as amended;

"OWRA" means the Ontario Water Resources Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. O.40, as amended;

"PA" means the Pesticides Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.11, as amended from time to time;

"Processed Waste" means electronic waste that has gone through this processing operation and has been dismantled into components that are acceptable to and destined for an end user;

"Provincial Officer" means any person designated in writing by the Minister as a provincial officer pursuant to section 5 of the OWRA or Section 5 of the EPA, Section 17 of the PA, Section 4 of the NMA, Section 8 of the SDWA;

"Regulation 347" means Regulation 347, R.R.O. 1990, General - Waste Management, made under the EPA, as amended from time to time;

"Residual Waste" means waste that is destined for final disposal;

"Site" means the entire 2.27 hectares waste disposal site, located at 7510 Bren Road, Mississauga, Ontario, approved by this Approval;

"Schedules" means the following Schedules attached to this Approval and forming part of this Approval namely: Schedule A- Supporting Documentation;

"Trained Personnel" means personnel knowledgeable in the following through instruction and/or practice:

1. relevant waste management legislation, regulations and guidelines;
2. major environmental concerns pertaining to the waste to be handled;
3. occupational health and safety concerns pertaining to the processes and materials to be handled;
4. management procedures including the use and operation of equipment for the processes and wastes to be handled;

5. emergency response procedures;
6. specific written procedures for the control of nuisance conditions;
7. specific written procedures for refusal of unacceptable loads; and
8. the requirements of this Approval;

"Unprocessed Waste" means electronic wastes received at the Site which has not fully completed the Owner's processing operation and is not yet in a form that is acceptable at an end user;

"Waste Diversion Transition Act" means the Waste Diversion Transition Act, 2016, S.O. 2016, c. 12, Sched. 2, as amended; and

"Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE)" means devices listed in Schedules 1 through 7 of Ontario Regulation 389/16.

*You are hereby notified that this environmental compliance approval is issued to you subject to the terms and conditions outlined below:*

## TERMS AND CONDITIONS

### **1.0 Compliance**

- 1.1 The Owner shall ensure compliance with all the conditions of this Approval and shall ensure that any person authorized to carry out work on or operate any aspect of the Site is notified of this Approval and the conditions herein and shall take all reasonable measures to ensure any such person complies with the same.
- 1.2 Any person authorized to carry out work on or operate any aspect of the Site shall comply with the conditions of this Approval.

### **2.0 In Accordance**

- 2.1 Except as otherwise provided for in this Approval, the Site shall be designed, developed, built, operated and maintained in accordance with the application for this Approval and the supporting documentation listed in Schedule "A".
- 2.2 (a) Use of the Site for any other type of waste, or other waste management activity, is not approved under this Approval, and requires obtaining a separate Approval amending this Approval; and  
  
(b) Applications to amend this Approval shall include submission of a revised Design and Operations Report.

### **3.0 Interpretation**

- 3.1 Where there is a conflict between a provision of any document, including the application, referred to in this Approval, and the conditions of this Approval, the conditions in this Approval shall take precedence.

- 3.2 Where there is a conflict between the application and a provision in any documents listed in Schedule "A", the application shall take precedence, unless it is clear that the purpose of the document was to amend the application and that the Ministry approved the amendment.
- 3.3 Where there is a conflict between any two (2) documents listed in Schedule "A", other than the application, the document bearing the most recent date shall take precedence.
- 3.4 The conditions of this Approval are severable. If any condition of this Approval, or the application of any condition of this Approval to any circumstance, is held invalid or unenforceable, the application of such condition to other circumstances and the remainder of this Approval shall not be affected thereby.

#### **4.0 Other Legal Obligations**

4.1 The issuance of, and compliance with, this Approval does not:

- (a) relieve any person of any obligation to comply with any provision of any applicable statute, regulation or other legal requirement; or
- (b) limit in any way the authority of the Ministry to require certain steps to be taken or to require the Owner and Operator to furnish any further information related to compliance with this Approval.

4.2 All waste at the Site shall be managed and disposed in accordance with the EPA and Ontario Regulation 347.

4.3 The Owner shall ensure that:

- (a) all equipment discharging to air operating at the Site are approved under Section 9 of the EPA; and
- (b) all effluent is discharged in accordance with OWRA.

#### **5.0 Adverse Effect**

5.1 The Owner shall take steps to minimize and ameliorate any adverse effect on the natural environment or impairment of water quality resulting from the Site, including such accelerated or additional monitoring as may be necessary to determine the nature and extent of the effect or impairment.

5.2 Despite an Owner, Operator, or any other person fulfilling any obligations imposed by this Approval the person remains responsible for any contravention of any other condition of this Approval or any applicable statute, regulation, or other legal requirement resulting from any act or omission that caused the adverse effect to the natural environment or impairment of water quality.

#### **6.0 Change of Owner**

6.1 The Owner shall notify the Director, in writing, and forward a copy of the notification to the District Manager, within thirty (30) days of the occurrence of any changes in the following information:

- (a) the ownership of the Site;
- (b) appointment of, or a change in, the Operator of the Site;
- (c) the name or address of the Owner; and
- (d) the partners, where the Owner is or at any time becomes a partnership and a copy of the most recent declaration filed under the Business Name Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. B.17, shall be included in the notification.

6.2 No portion of this Site shall be transferred or encumbered prior to or after closing of the Site unless the Director is notified in advance and sufficient financial assurance is deposited with the Ministry to ensure that these conditions will be carried out.

6.3 In the event of any change in ownership of the works, other than change to a successor municipality, the Owner shall notify the successor of and provide the successor with a copy of this Approval, and the Owner shall provide a copy of the notification to the District Manager and the Director.

## **7.0 Financial Assurance**

7.1 The Owner shall maintain to the Director, financial assurance, as defined in Section 131 of the Act, in the amount of \$271,760.00. This financial assurance shall be in a form acceptable to the Director and shall provide sufficient funds for the analysis, transportation, Site clean-up, monitoring and disposal of all quantities of waste on the Site at any one time.

7.2 Commencing on January 31, 2029 and at intervals of five (5) years thereafter, the Owner shall submit to the Director, a re-evaluation of the amount of financial assurance to implement the actions required under Condition 7.1. The re-evaluation shall include an assessment based on any new information relating to the environmental conditions of the Site and shall include the costs of additional monitoring and/or implementation of contingency plans required by the Director upon review of the closure plan and annual reports. The financial assurance must be submitted to the Director within twenty (20) days of written acceptance of the re-evaluation by the Director.

7.3 The amount of financial assurance is subject to review at any time by the Director and may be amended at his/her discretion.

7.4 If any financial assurance is scheduled to expire or notice is received, indicating financial assurance will not be renewed, and satisfactory methods have not been made to replace the financial assurance at least sixty (60) days before the financial assurance terminated, the financial assurance shall forthwith be replaced by cash.

## **8.0 Inspections**

8.1 No person shall hinder or obstruct a Provincial Officer from carrying out any and all inspections authorized

by the OWRA, the EPA, or the PA, of any place to which this Approval relates, and without limiting the foregoing:

- (a) to enter upon the premises where the approved works are located, or the location where the records required by the conditions of this Approval are kept;
- (b) to have access to, inspect, and copy any records required to be kept by the conditions of this Approval;
- (c) to inspect the Site, related equipment and appurtenances;
- (d) to inspect the practices, procedures, or operations required by the conditions of this Approval; and
- (e) to sample and monitor for the purposes of assessing compliance with the terms and conditions of this Approval or the EPA, the OWRA, or the PA.

## **9.0 Information and Record Retention**

9.1 Any information requested by the Ministry, concerning the Site and its operation under this Approval, including but not limited to any records required to be kept by this Approval shall be provided to the Ministry, upon request, in a timely manner.

9.2 The receipt of any information by the Ministry or the failure of the Ministry to prosecute any person or to require any person to take any action, under this Approval or under any statute, regulation or other legal requirement, in relation to the information, shall not be constructed as:

- (a) an approval, waiver, or justification by the Ministry of any act or omission of any person that contravenes any terms or condition of this Approval or any statute, regulation or other legal requirements; or
- (b) acceptance by the Ministry of the information's completeness or accuracy.

9.3 Any information relating to this Approval and contained in Ministry files may be made available to the public in accordance with the provisions of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.F-31 as amended.

9.4 All records and monitoring data required by the conditions of this Approval must be kept on the Owner's premises for a minimum period of two (2) years from the date of their creation.

## **10.0 Approved Waste Types, Quantities, and Processes**

10.1 The Owner shall only accept at this Site solid waste limited to Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment generated within Canada and the United States of America from residential, industrial, commercial and institutional sources.

10.2 The Owner shall ensure that:

- (a) the total amount of Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment accepted at the Site shall not exceed 250 tonnes per day;
- (b) the total amount of Unprocessed Waste and Processed Waste stores on Site shall not exceed 1,250 tonnes at any one time; and
- (c) the total amount of Residual Waste stored on Site shall not exceed 30 tonnes at any one time subject to the following limits:
  - (i) the maximum amount of lead contaminated dust from the baghouse on Site shall not exceed 20 tonnes at any one time; and
  - (ii) the maximum amount of non-hazardous waste on Site shall not exceed 10 tonnes at any one time.
- (d) the total amount of reject water from the float sink system stored on Site shall not exceed 30 cubic metres at any one time.
  - (i) the Owner shall ensure that an equal volume of spill containment is provided for the double-walled holding tank; or
  - (ii) the Owner shall install sensors to detect leaks or maximum liquid levels that are interlocked to shut down the process line to prevent an uncontrolled release of reject water.

10.3 Prior to being accepted at the Site, all incoming waste shall be inspected by a Trained Personnel and shall only be permitted to enter the Site if the Site is approved to accept that type of waste.

10.4 In the event that unacceptable waste is received at the Site, the Owner shall:

- (a) refuse receipt of the unacceptable waste and return the waste to the generator if safe to do so; or
- (b) if return of the waste is not feasible, the Owner shall isolate the unacceptable waste and remove it from the Site within seven (7) days in accordance with Regulation 347; and
- (c) the Owner shall review the incident and take appropriate steps to prevent future receipt of unacceptable waste; and
- (d) notify the District Manager, in writing, of the incident and the resolution within seven (7) business days of the incident.

10.5 Hazardous waste, as defined by Regulation 347, shall not be accepted at the Site, but may be generated at the Site during the manual/automated dismantling and removal of Hazardous Components. As such, intact batteries and intact mercury-containing lamps or switches may be accepted at the Site and that hazardous waste restrictions apply to materials generated on-site or to materials received in a damaged or non-intact condition.

10.6 In the event that Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment or Processed Waste cannot be removed from the Site and the total storage capacity as approved in Condition 10.2 is reached, the Owner:

- (a) must cease accepting additional waste to ensure the total approved storage capacity does not exceed the maximum amount approved by the Approval;
- (b) shall submit to the District Manager, a written schedule for removal the stores waste, within five (5) days of reaching the storage capacity; and
- (c) shall remove stored waste in accordance with the schedule required in Condition 10.6 (b).

10.7 The Owner shall ensure that the waste management activities undertaken at this Site are limited to:

- (a) receipt of waste;
- (b) manual sorting and manual/ automated dismantling of waste;
- (c) mechanical processing and separation of non-hazardous Processed Waste (i.e. waste that is not, or does not contain, Hazardous Components);
- (d) temporary storage of waste; and
- (e) transfer of Processed Waste and Residual Waste.

## **11.0 Hours of Operation**

11.1 The Owner shall only accept and/or transfer waste at the Site between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 12:00 a.m., Monday to Friday, unless otherwise restricted by Municipal by-law.

11.2 The Owner may operate on the Site twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per week, unless otherwise restricted by Municipal by-law.

11.3 Notwithstanding Condition 10.1 and 10.2 above, waste generated through emergency clean-up activities, including waste resulting from the clean-up of natural disasters, spills, or accidents, may be received at the Site twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per week, unless otherwise restricted by Municipal by-laws.

11.4 The waste handling operations shall comply with the Municipality Noise By-law.

## **12.0 Signage and Security**

12.1 The Owner shall post and maintain a sign which clearly identifies:

- (a) the name of the Site;

(b) the Approval number; and

(c) a twenty-four (24) hour phone number to contact the Owner in the event of a complaint or emergency.

12.2 The Site shall be maintained in a secure manner, so that unauthorized persons cannot enter the Site.

12.3 No waste shall be received at the Site except when the Site is under the supervision of a competent person.

### **13.0 Waste Storage**

13.1 (a) All waste shall be received, processed, stored and loaded for transfer within the confines of the building with the exception of roll-off bins for processed steel materials, one (1) non-ferrous metal bin, two (2) aluminium bins, five (5) mixed metal bins which may be stored outside the building within a fenced perimeter in accordance with zoning-by law.

(b) All waste (including Unprocessed Waste, Processed Waste and Residual Waste) shall be stored in suitable containers which facilitate a safe transfer and shipment, including but not limited to shipping boxes, bunkers, Gaylord boxes and pallets.

(c) Hazardous Components removed from electronic waste shall not be processed beyond manual or automated dismantling required to remove them from the original Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment item. No shredding, crushing or chemical treatment of these hazardous Component is permitted.

(d) Hazardous Components shall be stored separately in a secure manner that prevents spills, breakage, or environmental release, including but not limited to:

i) Batteries in crush-proof, non-conductive containers;

ii) Cathode Ray Tubes (CRTs) in gaylords secured onto pallets;

iii) Fluorescent tubes in crush-proof containers;

iv) Mercury switches or bulbs in crush-proof, leak-proof containers with secondary containment.

(e) Batteries shall be stored separately by chemistry (e.g., lithium-ion, nickel-cadmium, lead-acid). Storage shall prevent spontaneous ignition, including isolation of lithium batteries and use of fire-resistant containers.

(f) Other Hazardous Components shall be handled and stored securely, including:

i) Printed Circuit Boards (PCBs) in closed containers or bags to avoid dispersion.

ii) Plastics containing Brominated Flame Retardants (BFRs) in closed containers or bags to avoid dispersion.

iii) Lead-containing glass from CRTs in heavy-duty lined containers to prevent breakage and lead dust release.

iv) Capacitors and transformers containing hazardous substances stored upright in sealed containers to prevent leakage.

v) Mercury- containing backlights or switches in crush-proof, leak-proof containers with secondary containment.

(g) All Hazardous Components shall be segregated by type and stored in clearly labelled containers indicating contents and hazards. Inventory logs shall be maintained for all Hazardous Components.

13.2 (a) Unprocessed Waste shall not be stored on site for longer than one-hundred and eighty (180) days from the time of receipt;

(b) Processed Waste shall not be stored on site for longer than one (1) year; and

(c) Hazardous Components shall be transferred from the Site in accordance with Regulation 347 at least every ninety (90) days.

13.3 All waste shall be stored in accordance with the requirements of the Ontario Fire Code.

#### **14.0 Nuisance Control**

14.1 The Owner shall operate and maintain the Site in a manner which ensures the health and safety of all persons and the protection of the environment through active prevention of any possible environmental adverse effects, including but not be limited to odours, dust, litter, vectors, vermin, rodents and noise.

14.2 If at any time problems such as odours, dust, litter, noise vectors, vermin, rodents or other nuisances are generated at the Site, including all on-Site roads, the Owner shall take appropriate, immediate remedial action to eliminate the problem.

#### **15.0 Site Inspections and Preventative Maintenance**

15.1 (a) On each operating day, the Owner shall ensure that a visual inspection is carried out by a competent person of the storage, processing and loading/unloading areas and the security features of the Site.

(b) On a monthly basis, the Owner shall ensure an inspection of emergency response equipment by a competent person.

(c) Any deficiencies, that might negatively impact the environment detected during inspections shall be promptly corrected.

15.2 The Owner shall develop and implement a preventative maintenance program, in accordance with

manufacturer's recommendations, for all on-site equipment associated with the processing and managing of waste. The preventative maintenance program shall be available on Site for inspection by a Provincial Officer upon request.

## **16.0 Spills and Emergency Response and Reporting**

16.1 The Owner shall promptly take all necessary steps to contain and clean up any spills or upsets which result from this operation.

16.2 All spills, as defined in the Act, shall be immediately reported to the Ministry's Spill Action Centre at 1-800-268-6060 and shall be recorded in a written log or an electronic file format, as to the nature of the spill or upset, and action taken for clean-up, correction and prevention of future occurrences.

16.3 The Owner shall have in place an emergency response plan for the Site. The plan shall include, but is not limited to:

- (a) emergency response procedures to be undertaken in the event of a spill, process upset, fire, explosion or other incident;
- (b) a list of contingency equipment (e.g. fire suppression equipment, spill clean up kits, etc.) available in the event of a spill, process upset, fire, explosion or other incident and secondary containment shall be provided for liquid-containing components;
- (c) a list of names and telephone numbers of resources available for emergency response; and
- (d) a notification protocol with names and telephone numbers of persons to be contacted, including company personnel, the Ministry's Spills Action Centre and District office, the local Municipality and Fire Department and local medical resources.

16.4 A copy of the emergency response plan shall be kept in a prominent, central location available to all staff at all times.

16.5 The Owner shall ensure that:

- (a) the equipment and materials outlined in the emergency response plan are in good state of repair, fully operational and immediately available; and
- (b) all staff are fully trained in the equipment and materials' use and in the procedures to be employed in the event of an emergency.

16.6 The Owner shall review the emergency response plan on annual basis and ensure that, as a minimum, the contact names and numbers required by Condition 16.3 (c) are up to date.

16.7 The Owner shall have in place a written contingency plan which specifies, as a minimum the procedures to be followed in the event of a labour disruption, transportation disruption, inability of receiving sites to

accept waste or other business disruption to the operation.

## **17.0 Training**

- 17.1 (a) The Owner shall ensure that Site personnel are trained, and received annual refresher training, on the operation and management of the Site, or area(s) within the Site, in accordance with the specific job requirements of each individual, including but not limited to:
- (i) an outline of the responsibilities of the Site personnel;
  - (ii) personnel training protocols;
  - (iii) any environmental concerns pertaining to the wastes accepted at the Site;
  - (iv) occupational health and safety concerns pertaining to the wastes received and the use of personal protective equipment's;
  - (v) proper receiving and recording procedures (including recording procedures of wastes which are refused at the Site);
  - (vi) proper storage, handling, sorting, and shipping of Unprocessed and Processed Waste, as well as proper handling, storage and shipping of Hazardous Components;
  - (vii) operation of equipment and procedures to be followed in the event of a process upset or an emergency situation;
  - (viii) recording procedures as required under Condition 19.1;
  - (ix) inspection procedures, as required under Condition 15.1; and
  - (x) procedures for recording and responding to public complaints.
- (b) the Owner shall ensure that Site personnel who oversee operations at the Site are trained, and receive annual refresher training in:
- (i) relevant waste management legislation, including but not limited to Ontario Regulation 347; and
  - (ii) terms, conditions and operating requirements of this Approval.

## **18.0 Complaints**

18.1 If at any time, the Owner receives complaints regarding the operation of the Site, the Owner shall respond to these complaints according to the following procedure:

- (a) the Owner shall record each complaint on a formal complaint form entered in a sequentially numbered

log book or an electronic files;

- (b) the Owner shall initiate appropriate steps to determine all possible causes of the complaint, proceed to take the necessary actions to eliminate the cause of the complaint and forward a formal reply to the complainant; and
- (c) the Owner shall notify the District Manager, in writing, of the complaint and the resolution within seven (7) business days of the complaint occurring.

## **19.0 Record Keeping**

19.1 The Owner shall maintain, in written or electronic format, daily records which shall include the following information:

- (a) date of record;
- (b) types, quantities and sources of waste received that day;
- (c) quantities and destination of Processed Waste and Residual Waste shipped from the Site that day;
- (d) quantities of waste stores on Site at the end of each operating day; and
- (e) any spills or upsets which occurred that day.

19.2 The Owner shall keep a record of the inspections required by Condition 15.1 on Site, available for review by a Provincial Officer upon request, which includes as a minimum:

- (a) the date and time of inspections;
- (b) the results of the inspections; and
- (c) the signature of the competent person.

19.3 The Owner shall maintain at the Site a written record of employee training which includes:

- (a) date of training;
- (b) name and signature of person who has been trained; and
- (c) description of the training provided.

## **20.0 Annual Report**

20.1 By March 31st of each year, the Owner shall prepare and submit to the District Manager, a written annual

report covering the previous calendar year. The report shall be retained on Site in a central location and shall include, at a minimum, the following information:

- (a) a detailed monthly summary of the information required by Condition 19.1 (1) and 19.1 (2) including an annualized reconciliation between all wastes received at the Site and all waste transferred from the Site;
- (b) a summary of waste loads refused including the generator of the load, the licensed hauler of the load if the generator cannot be determined, the date of refusal and reason for refusal of the load;
- (c) any environmental and operational problems, that are likely to negatively impact the environment, encountered during the operation of the Site and during the facility inspections and any mitigative actions taken;
- (d) a summary of complaints received and the actions taken to mitigate the issue associated with the complaint;
- (e) a summary of any changes to the Spill Prevention Control and Countermeasures Plan since the last annual report; and
- (f) any recommendations to minimize environmental impacts from the operation of the Site and to improve Site operations and monitoring programs in this regard.

## **21.0 Closure Plan**

- 21.1 (a) The Owner shall submit, for Approval by the District Manager, a written closure plan six (6) months prior to the permanent closure of the Site. This plan must include, as a minimum, a description of the work that will be done to facilitate closure of the Site, a site assessment and a schedule for completion of that work; and
- (b) Within ten (10) days after closure of the Site, the Owner must notify the Director and District Manager, in writing that the Site is closed and that the Site closure plan has been implemented.

## **22.0 Design and Operations Report**

- 22.1 The Owner shall maintain an up to date Design and Operations Report which accurately reflects the physical layout of the Site and the operational procedures followed at the Site. The report shall include, but not be limited to:
  - (a) a property plan, showing the location of Site, fences, gates, tanks, storage pads, other buildings, truck routes etc;
  - (b) specification of the storage tanks and storage areas;

- (c) an engineering drawing that is to scale showing the various processing activities within the on-site buildings including a detailed description of waste receiving, handling, storage and transferring protocols;
- (d) an engineering drawing that is to scale showing the processing line and equipment used including a detailed description and function of the various equipment;
- (e) a calculation of maximum waste receiving capacity and storage capacity;
- (f) a description of all protection measures and procedures in place at the Site to address potential sources of adverse effects;
- (g) emergency response procedures and contingency plans; and
- (h) staff training requirements.

22.2 The Design and Operations Report shall be retained at the Site and be available for inspection by a Provincial Officer.

22.3 A copy of the most current Design and Operations Report shall be submitted to the Director in support of any applications for amendment to this Approval.

### **23.0 Stormwater and Wastewater Management**

23.1 The Owner shall ensure that contact between stormwater and received waste, processed waste and residual waste does not occur at any time at the Site.

23.2 The Owner shall manage all discharges from this Site, including sanitary and stormwater runoff, in accordance with appropriate municipal, provincial, and/or federal legislation, regulations, and by-laws.

The reason for Conditions 2.1 and 2.2 is to ensure that the Site is designed, operated and maintained in accordance with the application and supporting documentation submitted by the Owner, and not in a manner which the Director has not been asked to consider.

The reason for Conditions 3.1, 3.2, 3.3 and 3.4 is to clarify how to interpret this Approval in relation to the application and supporting documentation submitted by the Owner.

The reason for Condition 6.1 is to ensure that the Site is operated under the corporate name which appears on the application form submitted for this Approval.

The reason for Condition 6.2 is to restrict potential transfer or encumbrance of the Site without the Approval of the Director. Transfer of encumbrance can be made only on the basis that it will not endanger compliance with this Approval.

The reason for Condition 6.3 is to ensure that subsequent owners of the Site are informed of the terms and conditions of this Approval. This also applies to all supporting documentation listed in Schedule 1.

The reason for Conditions 7.1, 7.2, 7.3 and 7.4 is to ensure that sufficient funds are available to the Ministry to carry out all expected closure activities and any contingencies.

The reason for Condition 8.1 is to ensure that appropriate Ministry staff has ready access to the Site for inspection of facilities, equipment, practices and operations required by the conditions in this Approval. This condition is supplementary to the powers of entry afforded a Provincial Officer pursuant to the Act and OWRA.

The reason for Conditions 9.1 and 9.4 is to ensure the availability of records and drawings for inspection and information purposes.

The reason for Conditions 10.1 and 10.2 is to specify the approved areas from which waste may be accepted at the Site, and the types and amounts of waste that may be accepted at the Site, based on the Owner's application and supporting documentation.

The reason for Conditions 10.3, 10.4, 10.5, 10.6 and 10.7 is to ensure that the types and quantities of waste received at the Site and waste management activities are in accordance with that approved under this Approval.

The reason for Condition 11.1 is to specify the hours of operation for the Site based on the Owner's application and supporting documentation.

The reason for Condition 12.1 is to ensure that emergency responders and the public have the necessary contact information in the event of an emergency or complaint.

The reason for Condition 12.2 and 12.3 is to minimize the risk of unauthorized entry and to ensure the Site is only operated in the presence of Trained Personnel and to ensure proper management of waste.

Conditions 13.1, 13.2, and 13.3 are included to ensure that waste storage is done in a manner and duration which does not result in a nuisance or a hazard to the health and safety of the environment or people.

The reason for Conditions 14.1 and 14.2 is to ensure that the site is operated in a manner which does not result in a nuisance or a hazard to the health and safety of the environment or people.

The reason for Condition 15.1 and 15.2 is to ensure that all equipment and facilities are maintained in good working order.
