You have applied under section 20.2 of Part II.1 of the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. E. 19 (Environmental Protection Act) for approval of:

0.4 ha waste disposal site to be used for the transfer and processing of the following types of waste:

municipal special waste limited to empty oil and antifreeze containers and residual oil and antifreeze waste class no. 254 and empty pesticide and herbicide containers and residual pesticide and herbicide waste classes 242 and 269 as per conditions of this Approval.

Note: Use of the site for any other type of waste is not approved under this environmental compliance approval, and requires obtaining a separate approval amending this environmental compliance approval.

For the purpose of this environmental compliance approval, the following definitions apply:

1. "Approval" and "ECA" means this Environmental Compliance Approval and any Schedules to it, including the application and supporting documentation listed in Schedule "A";
2. "Director" means any Ministry employee appointed in writing by the Minister pursuant to section 5 of the EPA as a Director for the purposes of Part II.1 of the EPA;
3. "District Manager" means the District Manager of the local district office of the Ministry in which the Site is geographically located;
4. "EPA" and "Act" means Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. E. 19, as amended;
5. "Ministry" means the Ontario Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks;

6. "Municipal special waste" means waste as described in the Ontario Regulation 387/16 under Waste Diversion Transition Act, 2016. S.O. 2016, c. 12, Sched 2;
7. "Operator " means any person, other than the Owner's employees, authorized by the Owner as having the charge, management or control of any aspect of the site, and includes its successors or assigns;
8. "Other Containers" mean empty plastic containers (drums, totes and other types) having reached their end of life and are accepted at the Owner's Burlington facility and transferred to the Owner's Quebec facility. Those containers will come from a variety of recuperation centres of plastic and program's like: Stewardship Ontario box program, RTQ, Safety Kleen, Terrapure, Clean Farms and GFL. All containers are empty and clean of original content.
9. "Owner" means any person that is responsible for the establishment or operation of the Site being approved by this Approval, and includes RPM Environnement Ltée, its successors and assigns;
10. "OWRA" means the Ontario Water Resources Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. O-40, as amended from time to time;
11. "PA" means the Pesticides Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P-11, as amend from time to time;
12. "Putrescible Waste" means organic waste that decomposes, such as food waste;
13. "Provincial Officer" means any person designated in writing by the Minister as a provincial officer pursuant to section 5 of the OWRA or section 5 of the EPA or section 17 of PA.
14. "Regional Director" means the Regional Director of the local Regional Office of the Ministry in which the Site is located;
15. "Reg. 347" means Regulation 347, R.R.O. 1990, made under the EPA, as amended from time to time;
16. "Site" means the entire waste disposal site, located at 3166 Mainway, Burlington City, Regional Municipality of Halton, approved by this Approval; and
17. "Trained personnel" means knowledgeable in the following through instruction and/or practice:
 - a. relevant waste management legislation, regulations and guidelines;
 - b. major environmental concerns pertaining to the waste to be handled;
 - c. occupational health and safety concerns pertaining to the processes and wastes to be handled;
 - d. management procedures including the use and operation of equipment for the processes and wastes to be handled;
 - e. emergency response procedures;
 - f. specific written procedures for the control of nuisance conditions;
 - g. specific written procedures for management of unacceptable waste loads;
 - h. the requirements of this Approval.

You are hereby notified that this environmental compliance approval is issued to you subject to the terms and conditions outlined below:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1.0 Compliance

- 1.1 The Owner shall ensure compliance with all the conditions of this Approval and shall ensure that any person authorized to carry out work on or operate any aspect of the Site is notified of this Approval and the conditions herein and shall take all reasonable measures to ensure any such person complies with the same.
- 1.2 Any person authorized to carry out work on or operate any aspect of the Site shall comply with the conditions of this Approval.

2.0 In Accordance

- 2.1 Except as otherwise provided for in this Approval, the Site shall be operated and maintained in accordance with the application for this Approval and the supporting documentation listed in Schedule "A".
- 2.2
 - a. Use of the Site for any other type of waste, or other waste management activity, is not approved under this Approval, and requires obtaining a separate approval amending this Approval; and
 - b. Applications to amend this Approval, for reasons other than administrative amendments, shall include submission of a revised Design and Operations Report.

3.0 Interpretation

- 3.1 Where there is a conflict between a provision of any document, including the application, referred to in this Approval, and the conditions of this Approval, the conditions in this Approval shall take precedence.
- 3.2 Where there is a conflict between the application and a provision in any documents listed in Schedule "A", the application shall take precedence, unless it is clear that the purpose of the document was to amend the application and that the Ministry approved the amendment.
- 3.3 Where there is a conflict between any two documents listed in Schedule "A", other than the application, the document bearing the most recent date shall take precedence.
- 3.4 The conditions of this Approval are severable. If any condition of this Approval, or the application of any condition of this Approval to any circumstance, is held invalid or unenforceable, the application of such condition to other circumstances and the remainder of this Approval shall not be affected thereby.

4.0 Other Legal Obligations

- 4.1 The issuance of, and compliance with, this Approval does not:
 - a. relieve any person of any obligation to comply with any provision of any applicable statute, regulation or other legal requirement; or
 - b. limit in any way the authority of the Ministry to require certain steps be taken or to require the Owner to furnish any further information related to compliance with this Approval.
- 4.2 The Owner shall ensure that:
 - a. all wastes at the Site shall be managed and disposed in accordance with the EPA and Regulation 347;

and

b. all wastes transported to and from the Site shall be transported in accordance with the EPA and Regulation 347.

4.3 The Owner shall ensure that:

a. all equipment are not operated unless all approvals under Section 9 of the EPA and under Section 53 of the OWRA, where applicable, have been obtained; and

b. all direct effluent discharges from this Site are managed in accordance with appropriate Municipal, Provincial and/or Federal Legislation, Regulations and By-laws.

5.0 Adverse Effect

5.1 The Owner shall take steps to minimize and ameliorate any adverse effect on the natural environment or impairment of water quality resulting from the Site, including such accelerated or additional monitoring as may be necessary to determine the nature and extent of the effect or impairment.

5.2 Despite an Owner, Operator or any other person fulfilling any obligations imposed by this Approval, the person remains responsible for any contravention of any other condition of this Approval or any applicable statute, regulation, or other legal requirement resulting from any act or omission that caused the adverse effect to the natural environment or impairment of water quality.

6.0 Change of Owner

6.1 The Owner shall notify the Director in writing, and forward a copy of the notification to the District Manager, within thirty (30) days of the occurrence of any changes:

a. the ownership of the Site;

b. the Operator of the Site;

c. the address of the Owner or Operator;

d. the partners, where the Owner is or at any time becomes a partnership and a copy of the most recent declaration filed under the Business Names Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. B.17 shall be included in the notification; and,

e. the name of the corporation where the Owner is or at any time becomes a corporation, other than a municipal corporation, and a copy of the most current information filed under the Corporations Information Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. C.39 shall be included in the notification.

6.2 No portion of this Site shall be transferred or encumbered prior to or after closing of the Site unless the Director is notified in advance and sufficient financial assurance is deposited with the Ministry to ensure that these conditions will be carried out. In the event of any change in ownership of the Site, the Owner shall notify the successor of and provide the successor with a copy of this Approval, and the Owner shall provide a copy of the notification to the District Manager and the Director.

6.3 In the event of any change in ownership of the Site, other than change to a successor municipality, the Owner shall notify the successor of, and provide the successor with a copy of this Approval, and the Owner shall provide a copy of the notification to the District Manager and the Director.

7.0 Financial Assurance

- 7.1 Within twenty (20) days of issuance of this Approval, the Owner shall submit to the Director financial assurance as defined in Section 131 of the EPA, in the amount of \$85,154.23 for a total of \$107,081.23. This financial assurance shall be in a form acceptable to the Director and shall provide sufficient funds for the analysis, transportation, Site clean-up, monitoring and disposal of all quantities of waste on the Site at any one time.
- 7.2 Commencing on March 31, 2031 and at intervals of five (5) years thereafter, the Owner shall submit to the Director, a re-evaluation of the amount of financial assurance to implement the actions required under Condition 7.1. The re-evaluation shall include an assessment based on any new information relating to the environmental conditions of the Site and shall include the costs of additional monitoring and/or implementation of contingency plans required by the Director upon review of the closure plan and annual reports. The financial assurance must be submitted to the Director within twenty (20) days of written acceptance of the re-evaluation by the Director.
- 7.3 The amount of financial assurance is subject to review at any time by the Director and may be amended at his/her discretion. If any financial assurance is scheduled to expire or notice is received, indicating Financial Assurance will not be renewed, and satisfactory methods have not been made to replace the financial assurance at least sixty (60) days before the financial assurance terminates, the financial assurance shall forthwith be replaced by cash.

8.0 Inspections

- 8.1 No person shall hinder or obstruct a Provincial Officer from carrying out any and all inspections authorized by the OWRA, the EPA, or the PA, of any place to which this Approval relates, and without limiting the foregoing:
- a. to enter upon the premises where the approved works are located, or the location where the records required by the conditions of this Approval are kept;
 - b. to have access to, inspect, and copy any records required to be kept by the conditions of this Approval;
 - c. to inspect the Site, related equipment and appurtenances;
 - d. to inspect the practices, procedures, or operations required by the conditions of this Approval; and
 - e. to sample and monitor for the purposes of assessing compliance with the terms and conditions of this Approval or the EPA, the OWRA or the PA.

9.0 Information and Record Retention

- 9.1 Any information requested, by the Ministry, concerning the Site and its operation under this Approval, including but not limited to any records required to be kept by this Approval shall be provided to the Ministry, upon request, in a timely manner.
- 9.2 The receipt of any information by the Ministry or the failure of the Ministry to prosecute any person or to require any person to take any action, under this Approval or under any statute, regulation or other legal requirement, in relation to the information, shall not be construed as:
- a. an approval, waiver, or justification by the Ministry of any act or omission of any person that contravenes any term or condition of this Approval or any statute, regulation or other legal requirement; or

b. acceptance by the Ministry of the information's completeness or accuracy.

9.3 All records and monitoring data required by the conditions of this Approval must be kept on the Owner's premises for a minimum period of five (5) years from the date of their creation.

9.4 Any information relating to this Approval and contained in Ministry files may be made available to the public in accordance with the provisions of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, R.S.O. 1990, C. F-31.

10.0 Service Area and Hours of Operations

10.1 The Site is approved to accept waste originating from the Provinces of Ontario, Manitoba, and Saskatchewan in Canada, and from the States of New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania in the United States of America.

10.2 This Site is approved to operate from 6:30 am to 12:00 pm, Monday to Friday.

10.3 Notwithstanding condition 10.2, the Site is approved to receive and ship the approved waste 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

11.0 Approved Waste Types, Quantities and Activities

11.1 This Site is approved for the receipt, transfer and processing of the following types of waste:

a. municipal special waste limited to empty oil and antifreeze containers, and Other Containers;

b. empty pesticide and herbicide containers collected and managed by Cleanfarms and delivered to the site; and,

c. residual oil and antifreeze waste class no. 254, residual halogenated pesticides and herbicides waste class 242 and residual organic non-halogenated pesticide and herbicide wastes class no. 269 as described in the Ministry of the Environment's "New Ontario Waste Classes" document dated January 1986, as amended from time to time;

11.2 Putrescible waste shall not be received at the Site.

11.3 Prior to being accepted at the Site, all incoming waste shall be inspected by a trained personnel and shall only be permitted to enter the Site if the Site is approved to accept that type of waste.

11.4 In the event that unacceptable waste is received at the Site, the Owner shall:

a. refuse receipt of the unacceptable waste and return the waste to the generator if safe to do so;

or

b. if return of the waste is not feasible, the Owner shall isolate the unacceptable waste and remove it from the Site within seven (7) days in accordance with Reg. 347; and

c. the Owner shall review the incident and take appropriate steps to prevent future receipt of unacceptable waste.

11.5 The Owner shall ensure that:

a. the maximum amount of waste accepted at the Site shall not exceed 30 tonnes per day;

b. the maximum amount of waste (unprocessed waste, processed waste) stored on Site shall not exceed

90 tonnes at any one time;

c. the maximum amount of liquid waste including residual oil and antifreeze and pesticides and herbicide stored or be present at the Site shall not exceed 10,000 litres at any one time.

11.6 If for any reason waste cannot be transferred from the Site, the Site shall cease accepting waste.

11.7 All waste shall be received, stored and processed within the confines of the transfer/processing building. No waste shall be stored outside.

12.0 Spill Containment

12.1 The Owner shall ensure that:

a. adequate secondary containment is maintained at all times for the storage and processing of all waste including residual oil and antifreeze and pesticide and herbicides, inside the building as described in Item 4 of Schedule "A"; and

b. storage of waste at the Site complies with the MOE document entitled "Guidelines for Environmental Protection Measures at Chemical and Waste Storage Facilities", dated May 2007, as amended from time to time.

12.2 The Owner shall install, operate and maintain an engineered liquid level management system for all sumps, pits, septic tanks, and liquid retention areas associated with the Site that are used to store oil, oily water, wash water, or other liquid wastes. The system shall include, at a minimum:

a. automatic pumping equipment designed to remove accumulated liquid prior to reaching maximum storage capacity;

b. a high-level alarm system, equipped with alerts, to warn Site personnel when liquid levels approach the maximum allowable capacity; and.

c. The Owner shall ensure that the system is inspected regularly, maintained in good working order, and remains fully operational at all times to prevent overflow and spillage.

13.0 Signage and Security

13.1 The Site shall be maintained in a secure manner, so that unauthorized persons cannot enter the Site.

13.2 A sign shall be posted in a prominent location at the Site entrance clearly stating:

a. the Owner's name;

b. the Approval number;

c. the hours of operation for receipt and transfer of waste; and

d. a 24-hour telephone number to call to reach the Owner in the event of an emergency or complaint.

14.0 Nuisance Control

14.1 The Owner shall operate and maintain the Site in a manner which ensures the health and safety of all persons and the protection of the environment through active prevention of any possible environmental adverse effects, including but not be limited to odours, dust, litter, vectors, vermin, rodents and noise.

14.2 If at any time problems such as odours, dust, litter, noise, vectors, vermin, rodents or other nuisances are

generated at the Site, the Owner shall take appropriate, immediate remedial action to eliminate the problem.

- 14.3 The Owner shall ensure that there is no queuing or parking of vehicles that are waiting to enter this Site on any roadway that is not a distinct part of this Site.

15.0 Site Inspections and Maintenance

- 15.1 a. On each operating day, the Owner shall ensure that a visual inspection is carried out by a competent person of the storage, processing and loading/unloading areas and the security features of the Site. The inspection shall ensure that all equipment and facilities are in good working order and operated in a manner that will not negatively impact the environment, that waste storage, unloading and loading areas are orderly and that security features are in good working order.
- b. On a monthly basis, the Owner shall ensure an inspection of emergency response equipment by a competent person.
- c. Any deficiencies, that might negatively impact the environment detected during inspections shall be promptly corrected.
- 15.2 The Owner shall develop and implement a preventative maintenance program, in accordance with manufacturer's recommendations, for all on-site equipment associated with the processing and managing of waste. The preventative maintenance program shall be available on Site for inspection by a Provincial Officer upon request.

16.0 Emergency and Contingency Planning and Response

- 16.1 The Owner shall take immediate measures to clean-up all spills, related discharges and process upsets of wastes which result from the operation of the Site.
- 16.2 All spills and upsets shall be immediately reported to the Ministry's Spills Action Centre at 416-325-3000 or 1-800-268-6060 and shall be recorded in a written log or an electronic file format, as to the nature of the spill or upset, and the action taken for clean-up, correction and prevention of future occurrences.
- 16.3 a. The Owner shall maintain an Emergency Preparedness and Response Plan for the Site. The Plan shall include, but not necessarily limited to:
- i. emergency response procedures to be undertaken in the event of a spill or process upset, including specific clean up methods for each individual waste;
 - ii. a list of contingency equipment and spill clean up materials, including names and telephone numbers of waste management companies available for emergency response;
- and
- iii. a notification protocol with names and telephone numbers of persons to be contacted, including Owner personnel, the Ministry of the Environment District Office and Spills Action Centre, the local Fire Department and the local Municipality.
- b. A copy of the Emergency Preparedness and Response Plan shall be kept on the Site at all times, in a central location available to all staff;
- c. The Owner shall ensure that the contingency equipment and materials outlined in the Emergency

Preparedness and Response Plan are immediately available on the Site at all times, in a good state of repair, and fully operational; and

- d. The Owner shall ensure that all operating personnel are fully trained in the use of the contingency equipment and materials outlined in the Emergency Preparedness and Response Plan, and in the procedures to be employed in the event of an emergency.

17.0 Training

17.1 The Owner shall ensure that Site personnel are trained, and receive annual refresher training, on the operation and management of the Site, or area(s) within the Site, in accordance with the specific job requirements of each individual, including but not limited to:

- a. an outline of the responsibilities of the Site personnel;
- b. personnel training protocols;
- c. any environmental concerns pertaining to the wastes accepted at the Site;
- d. occupational health and safety concerns pertaining to the wastes received;
- e. proper receiving and recording procedures (including recording procedures of wastes which are refused at the Site);
- f. proper storage, handling, sorting and shipping procedures;
- g. operation of equipment and procedures to be followed in the event of a process upset or an emergency situation; and
- h. procedures for recording and responding to public complaints.

17.2 The Owner shall ensure that Site personnel who oversee operations at the Site are trained, and receive annual refresher training in:

- a. relevant waste management legislation, including but not limited to Reg. 347; and
- b. terms, conditions and operating requirements of this Approval.

18.0 Complaints

18.1 If at any time, the Owner receives complaints regarding the operation of the Site, the Owner shall respond to these complaints according to the following procedure:

- a. the Owner shall record each complaint on a formal complaint form entered in a sequentially numbered log book or an electronic file;
- b. the Owner shall initiate appropriate steps to determine all possible causes of the complaint, proceed to take the necessary actions to eliminate the cause of the complaint and forward a formal reply to the complainant; and,
- c. the Owner shall notify the District Manager, in writing, of the complaint and the resolution within seven (7) business days of the complaint occurring.

19.0 Record Keeping

19.1 The Owner shall maintain, in written or electronic format, daily records which shall include the

following information:

- a. date of record;
 - b. types, quantities and source of waste received that day;
 - c. quantities and destination of waste shipped from the Site that day;
 - d. quantities of waste stored on Site at the end of each operating day; and
 - e. any spills or upsets which occurred that day.
- 19.2 The Owner shall keep a record of the inspections required by Condition 15.1 on Site, available for review by a Provincial Officer upon request, which includes as a minimum:
- a. the date and time of the inspections;
 - b. the results of the inspection; and
 - c. the signature of the competent person.
- 19.3 The Owner shall keep a record of the preventative maintenance performed as required by Condition 15.2 on Site, available for review by a Provincial Officer upon request, which includes as a minimum:
- a. the date and time when the preventative maintenance work was performed;
 - b. the equipment or part of equipment on which work was performed and the type of work performed;
and
 - c. the signature of the trained personnel.
- 19.4 The Owner shall maintain a written record of employee training at the Site, which includes:
- a. date of training;
 - b. name and signature of person who has been trained; and
 - c. description of the training provided.

20.0 Annual Report

- 20.1 By March 31st of each year, the Owner shall prepare and submit to the District Manager an annual report covering the previous calendar year. Each report shall include, as a minimum, the following information:
- a. a detailed monthly summary of the type and quantity of all wastes received;
 - b. a detailed monthly summary of the type and quantity of all waste transferred from the Site and the destination;
 - c. a summary of complaints received and actions taken in response;
 - d. any changes to the emergency response plan, the Design and Operations Report and the closure plan that have been approved by the Director since the last annual report;
 - e. any environmental and operation problems that could negatively impact the environment, encountered during the operation of the Site and during the facility inspections, and any mitigative actions taken;

and

f. a statement as to compliance with all Conditions of this Approval and with the inspection and reporting requirements of the Conditions herein.

21.0 Closure Plan

- 21.1 The Owner must submit, for approval by the Director, a written closure plan for the Site at least six (6) months prior to closure of the Site. This plan must include, as a minimum, a description of the work that will be done to facilitate closure of the Site and a schedule for completion of that work; and
- 21.2 Within ten (10) days after closure of the Site, the Owner must notify the Director and District Manager, in writing, that the Site has been closed in accordance with the approved closure plan.

The reasons for the imposition of these terms and conditions are as follows:

1. The reason for Conditions 1.0, 4.0, and 5.0 is to clarify the legal rights and responsibilities of the Owner under this Approval.
2. The reasons for Condition 2.0 is to ensure that the Site is designed, operated, monitored and maintained in accordance with the application and supporting documentation submitted by the Owner, and not in a manner which the Director has not been asked to consider.
3. The reason for Condition 3.0 is to clarify how to interpret this Approval in relation to the application and supporting documentation submitted by the Owner.
4. The reason for Condition 6.1 is to ensure that the Site is operated under the corporate name which appears on the application form submitted for this Approval.
5. The reason for Condition 6.2 is to restrict potential transfer or encumbrance of the Site without the approval of the Director. Any transfer of encumbrance can be made only on the basis that it will not endanger compliance with this Approval.
6. The reason for Condition 6.3 is to ensure that subsequent owners of the Site are informed of the terms and conditions of this Approval. This also applies to all supporting documentation listed in Schedule "A".
7. The reason for Condition 7.0 is to ensure that sufficient funds are available to the Ministry to clean up the Site in the event that the Owner is unable or unwilling to do so.
8. The reason for Condition 8.0 is to ensure that appropriate Ministry staff have ready access to the Site for inspection of facilities, equipment, practices and operations required by the conditions in this Approval. This condition is supplementary to the powers of entry afforded a Provincial Officer pursuant to the EPA and OWRA.
9. The reason for Condition 9.0 is to ensure the availability of records and drawings for inspection and information purposes.
10. The reason for Condition 10.0 is to specify the approved areas from which waste may be accepted at the Site and hours of operation based on the Owner's application and supporting documentation.
11. The reasons for Conditions 11.1, 11.5 and 11.7 are to specify the approved types and quantities of waste that may be accepted at the Site, and the waste management activities approved to take place at the Site, based on the Owner's application and supporting documentation.
12. The reason for Conditions 11.2, 11.3 and 11.4 is to ensure that the quantities of waste received at the Site are in accordance with that approved under this Approval.
13. The reason for Conditions, 11.6 and 12.1 and 12.2 is to ensure that waste storage is done in a manner and duration which does not result in a nuisance or a hazard to the health and safety of the environment or people.
14. The reason for Condition 13.1 is to minimize the risk of unauthorized entry to the Site.
15. The reason for Condition 13.2 is to ensure that emergency responders and the public have the necessary contact information in the event of an emergency or complaint.

16. The reason for Condition 14.0 is to ensure that the site is operated in a manner which does not result in a nuisance or a hazard to the health and safety of the environment or people.
17. The reason for Condition 15.0 is to ensure that all equipment and facilities are maintained in good working order.
18. The reason for Condition 16.1 is to ensure that the Owner immediately responds to a spill.
19. The reason for Condition 16.2 is to ensure that the Owner notifies the Ministry forthwith of any spills as required in Part X of the Act so that appropriate spills response can be determined.
20. The reason for Condition 16.3 is to ensure that the Owner is prepared and properly equipped to take action in the event of a spill, fire or other operation upset.
21. The reason for Condition 17.0 is to ensure that the Site is supervised and operated by properly trained staff thereby minimizing the risk of the operations resulting in a hazard or nuisance to the natural environment or any person.
22. The reason for Condition 18.0 is to ensure that complaints are properly and quickly resolved and that complaints and follow-up actions have been documented.
23. The reason for Conditions 19.0 and 20.0 is to ensure that accurate records are maintained to demonstrate compliance with the conditions in this Approval, the EPA and its regulations.
24. The reason for Condition 21.0 is to ensure that the Site is closed in accordance with Ministry standards and to protect the health and safety of the environment.

In accordance with Section 139 of the *Environmental Protection Act*, you may by written notice served upon me, the Ontario Land Tribunal and in accordance with Section 47 of the *Environmental Bill of Rights, 1993*, the Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks, within 15 days after receipt of this notice, require a hearing by the Tribunal. The Minister of the Environment, Conservation and Parks will place notice of your appeal on the Environmental Registry. Section 142 of the *Environmental Protection Act* provides that the notice requiring the hearing ("the Notice") shall state:

- a. The portions of the environmental compliance approval or each term or condition in the environmental compliance approval in respect of which the hearing is required, and;
- b. The grounds on which you intend to rely at the hearing in relation to each portion appealed.

Pursuant to subsection 139(3) of the *Environmental Protection Act*, a hearing may not be required with respect to any terms and conditions in this environmental compliance approval, if the terms and conditions are substantially the same as those contained in an approval that is amended or revoked by this environmental compliance approval.

The Notice should also include:

4. The date of the environmental compliance approval;
5. The name of the Director, and;

6. The municipality or municipalities within which the project is to be engaged in.
