- best practices in transportation management;
- climate change initiatives;
- cost management for future infrastructure maintenance;
- development goals contained within Bill 185, and
- economic benefits to businesses;

AND THAT the correspondence further request the provincial government to consider investing in funding public transportation goals to reduce traffic congestion and aide future developments to be built with less parking;
